**LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF THE YEAR 2022**  
**OF THE TOWN OF GROVELAND**  
**ENTITLED “SEWER USE RULES AND REGULATIONS”**

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Town Board of the Town of Groveland as follows:

**SECTION 1. TITLE AND SCOPE**

This local law shall be known as “A LOCAL LAW OF THE TOWN OF GROVELAND, LIVINGSTON COUNTY, NEW YORK TO ESTABLISH SEWER USE RULES AND REGULATIONS.”

**SECTION 2. AUTHORITY, HISTORY AND PURPOSE.**

A. Authority. This Local Law is adopted pursuant to the New York State Town Law § 64 and Articles 2 and 3 of the Municipal Home Rule Law, to protect and promote public health, safety, convenience, order, aesthetics, prosperity and general welfare of the Town of Groveland. This Local Law regulates the discharge of sanitary sewage and other types of wastes into any public sewer collection or treatment system within the Town of Groveland.

B. General Purpose. To these ends, this local law and the Chapter that it creates is designed to:

- (1) Enhance the orderly growth, development and redevelopment of the Town in accordance with a well-considered plan;
- (2) To provide for efficient, economic, environmentally safe, and legal operation of the publicly owned sanitary sewer system serving properties within the Town of Groveland.
- (3) Properly regulate the discharge of sanitary sewage and other types of wastes into any public sewer collection or treatment system benefitting the Town, in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Town and to protect the various public benefit infrastructure that collects and treats sanitary sewage and other types of wastes within and/or for the benefit of the Town;
- (4) To provide consistent rules and regulations for the Town of Groveland and the Livingston County Water and Sewer Authority so that each may properly administer their respective obligations with regard to such publicly owned facilities; and

- (5) Provide for efficient and effective enforcement of rules and regulations ensuring proper use of and discharge into the public sanitary sewer/waste water collection and treatment system and when such rules and regulations are violated, to seek proper enforcement against violating users.

C. Specific Purpose. The specific purposes of the rules and regulations created by this Local Law are the following:

- (1) To prevent the introduction of substances into the publicly owned sanitary sewer system that will:
  - (a) interfere with the publicly owned sanitary sewer system in any way;
  - (b) pass through the publicly owned sanitary sewer system to the State's Waters and cause contravention of standards for those waters or cause violation of the publicly owned sanitary sewer system 's SPDES Permit;
  - (c) increase the cost or otherwise hamper the disposal of publicly owned sanitary sewer system sludge and/or residuals;
  - (d) endanger Authority or any municipal employees;
  - (e) cause air pollution, or groundwater pollution, directly or indirectly; and
  - (f) cause, directly or indirectly, any public nuisance condition.
- (2) To prevent new sources of Infiltration and Inflow as much as possible and eliminate existing sources of Infiltration and Inflow.
- (3) To assure that new sewers and connections are properly constructed.
- (4) To provide for equitable distribution amongst all users of the POTW of all costs, associated with Sewage transmission, treatment, and residuals disposal, and to provide for the collection of such costs.
- (5) To provide enforcement mechanisms to ensure proper usage of the POTW to further the above purposes.

D. History. Both the Town of Groveland and the Livingston County Water and Sewer Authority own, operate and maintain certain sanitary sewer transmission and/or treatment improvements within the Town of Groveland that service residential and commercial properties within the Town.

SECTION 3. CONTINUITY WITH AND ADOPTION OF LIVINGSTON COUNTY WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITY SEWER USE RULES AND REGULATIONS.

A. Continuity. In order for the Livingston County Water and Sewer Authority to properly administer its obligations with regard to its facilities within the Town of Groveland, it is crucial that the Authority and Town have the same rules and regulations governing the use of and discharge into the public sanitary sewer and treatment system.

B. Adoption of Sewer Use Rules and Regulations. The Town of Groveland hereby adopts as its rules and regulations governing the use of and discharge into the public sanitary sewer and treatment system serving the Town of Groveland, the Livingston County Water and Sewer Authority Sewer Use Rules and Regulations as most recently adopted (as of the date of this local law) by the Livingston County Water and Sewer Authority on September 25, 2019 and as they may be periodically updated by the Livingston County Water and Sewer Authority from time-to-time. A copy of the most recent Livingston County Water and Sewer Authority Sewer Use Rules and Regulations along with the Intermunicipal Cooperation Agreement, as adopted herein by the Town of Groveland, will be available at the office of the Groveland Town Clerk and in the Town of Groveland Building and Zoning Office.

#### SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This local law shall be effective thirty (30) days after its filing with the Office of the Secretary of State.
